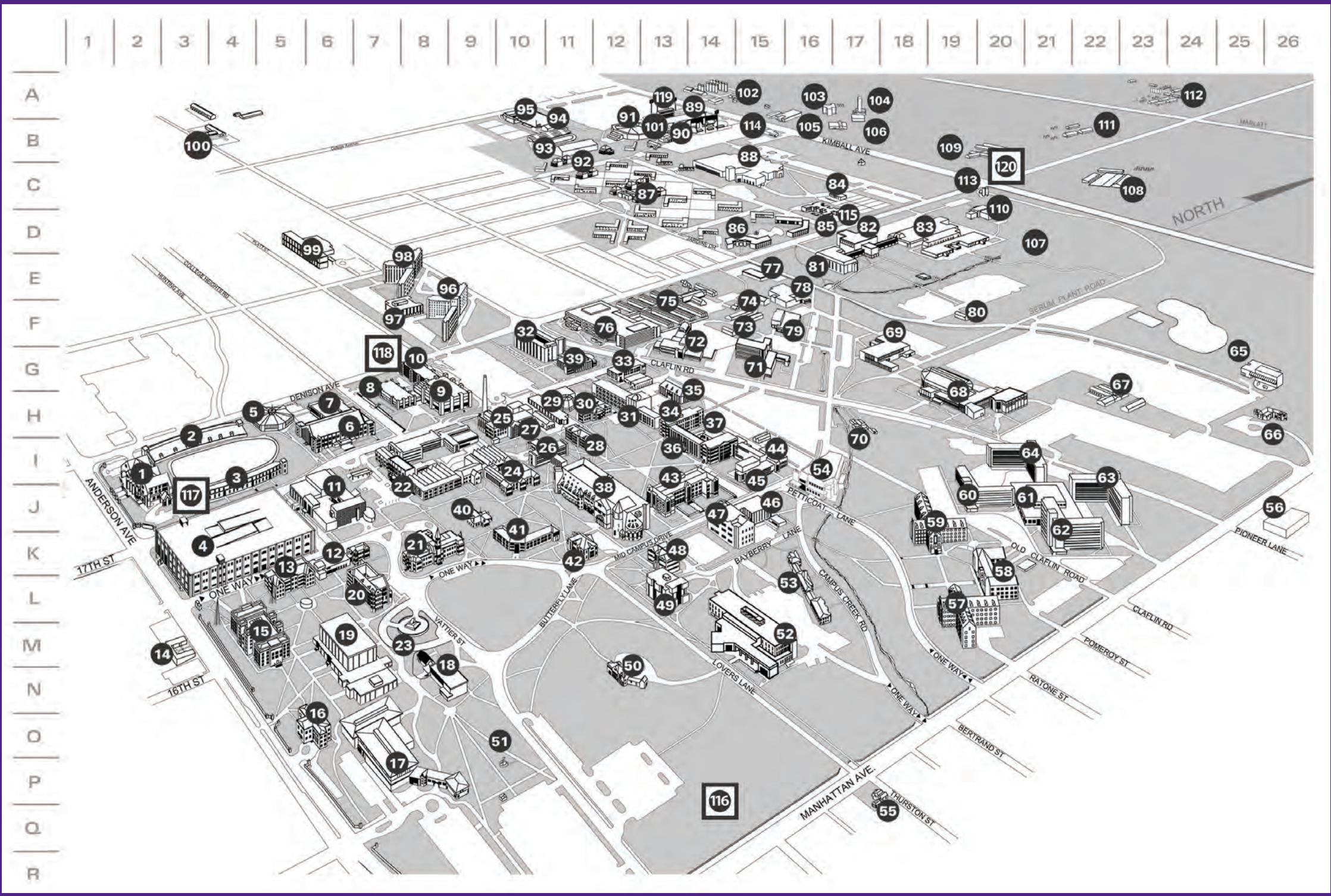

PROUD HISTORY



THE YEAR
1863

First operational land-grant in the nation. Founded in 1863, K-State also was the first public university in Kansas. In 2013, the university marked 150 years of service to Kansas and the world.
