





Sept. 28, 2019 - March 17, 2020 The museum's first international loan exhibition features more than 100 artifacts and works of art that tell the story of Irish soldier and artist Richard St. George, who fought for the British Army in the War for Independence and was ultimately killed by his Irish tenants during the Irish Revolution.
