



Hastings-on-Hudson Area Attractions (cont'd)

MacEachron Waterfront Park

Offers picnic tables, refreshing summer breezes and impressive views of the Palisades Cliffs, the Hudson River and New York City. Located just north of the Hastings-on-Hudson station.

Untermyer Park

A 35-acre park and garden on a bluff overlooking the Hudson River and the Palisades Cliffs. The park and garden are accessible off the Old Croton Aqueduct via a trail marked by four stone columns. Located about two miles south of Hastingson-Hudson.

Irvington Area Attractions

Irvington Town Hall Theater

Film series, concerts and local performing arts groups are featured in this historic theater on Main Street. *Call 914-591-6602 for info; Irvingtontheater.com*

The Lyndhurst Estate

The estate features spectacular grounds with stunning river views and is a pleasant walk or bike ride about one mile north of Irvington. Check Lyndhurst's web site for frequent special events. Access to the grounds is free to walkers or bicyclists arriving from the Old Croton Aqueduct. Go to Lyndhurst org for information.

Scenic Hudson Park

Tiffany Reading Room

Located in Irvington's village hall on Main Street, adjacent to the Town Hall Theater. Open during weekday business hours.

Washington Irving's Sunnyside Home

Walks, Bike Rides, Attractions

Old Croton Aqueduct Walk or Bike Ride

A relaxing, historic walk along a 19th-century aqueduct that once supplied water to New York City. You can easily walk or bike ride between the villages on the hardened dirt trail and return to your starting point by Metro-North Railroad. The full route on this map totals about seven miles. Bike rentals are available at Endless Trail Bikeworx, 56 Main St., Dobbs Ferry. See *Sponsors/Map*.

South County/Old Putnam Rail Trail

A tree-shaded bike ride along the paved right of way of a railroad built in the 19th century that goes for miles both north and south. You can access the trail by bicycle from the Old Croton Aqueduct through Hastings via a 1.2-mile, moderately hilly ride on local roads. You can park at Life: The Place to Be on Lawrence Street, just off the Saw Mill Parkway in Ardsley. Or, there is more limited parking on the east side of the parkway at the northbound exit for Farragut Avenue in Hastings.

Dobbs Ferry Attractions

Dobbs Ferry Waterfront Park

A wonderful place to walk, sit or picnic with sweeping views of the Hudson River, the Palisades cliffs, New York and the Hudson Highlands. The park is located next to the Dobbs Ferry train station.

Hastings-on-Hudson Area Attractions

The Newington-Cropsey Foundation's Museum of Hudson River Painters

This unique museum exhibits the permanent collection of 19th-century Hudson River School painter Jasper Cropsey and other temporary collections. Located across from the train station. *Call 914-478-7990 or visit newingtoncropsey.com for bours.*
