Wild Animal Safari wants you to have the best tour possible. Therefore, anyone caught abusing, mistreating or injuring an animal will be prosecuted.



It will serve as your ticket. You will need it to enter both the Drive-Thru and Walk-Thru sections of the park.

RULES & SAFETY TIPS

- Remember ... animals inside the Safari are wild. Please use extreme care at all times. Never cross or reach over a safety fence.
- Safari rules, and the State of Georgia, prohibit anyone from getting out of the vehicle inside the drive-thru area.
- If you have vehicle trouble inside the park, do not get out.
 Pull to the side of the road and call 706-523-2877. Safari attendants will come to your aid.
- Please pull to the side to allow tiger trucks, buses, and park staff to pass. Staff may be attending to an emergency.
- Do not roll your windows up with an animal's head inside.
 This may result in a broken window or injury to the animal.
 Drive forward slowly and the animal will move.
- Wild Animal Safari will not be responsible for injuries to visitors or damage to their cars. Guided bus tours (seasonal) are available at no additional cost. If you choose, you may rent (for an additional fee) a Zebra Van to tour the Safari
- Please do not throw litter from your car. Film, paper, can tabs, styrofoam cups and plastic wrapping can kill the animals.
- Fire is one of the greatest dangers to wildlife. Do not throw cigarettes, matches or similar items out of the vehicle.
- · No grills allowed to cook outside.
- Maximum speed through the park is 5 MPH. Never exceed this speed limit. The slower you drive, the more animals you will see.
- Always drive slowly and watch for animals. Do not bump animals that may be in the road. If you stop and feed the animals, always check the sides of your car to be sure that small animals are not feeding under the car.
- Alcohol, firearms, drugs or unruly behavior are not condoned and will not be tolerated.
- No open doors, tops or people in backs of trucks are allowed.
- No pets are allowed in the Drive-Thru or Walk-Thru sections. We do have free kennel service available. Service animals are permitted in the Walk About section if on a leash and not a danger to our animals. We reserve the right to ask anyone to remove a service animal that may be causing a safety issue or stressful condition to our animals.
- We sell our last ticket one hour before closing. This may not be sufficient time to visit the Safari. You may have a manager sign your ticket and return the next day to complete your visit if you enter the park with less than 2 hours of operation.
- There will be no refunds on Safari admission. Also, no rain checks or refunds are given for bad weather. Be sure that day, time and weather conditions are suitable to you before purchasing your ticket.
- Failure to abide by Safari rules may result in your immediate removal from the Safari. No refund will be given.

FEEDING DOS & DON'TS

- Never stick your hand or fingers into an animal's mouth.
- Please only feed park food to the animals.
 Other food could endanger or even kill some animals.
- When stopping to feed an animal, please pull to the side of the road to let others pass.

Be sure to wash your hands thoroughly after petting and feeding the animals.

Wild Animal Safari encourages you to feed any and all of the hoofed animals in the drive-thru section. However, in order to minimize the potential for injury, please toss the food away from the vehicle.

Please be aware of the following animals as they have been known to nip and peck. Extra caution should be exercised around these animals: **Zebras & Zedonks**, **Ostriches**, **Emus & Rheas & Camels**
