PLAN YOUR VISIT

Bloedel Reserve is a blend of woodlands, meadows, wildlife habitats, and distinct landscapes and gardens. You won't find plant ID tags or directional signage along the trails. Immerse yourself in nature and let your imagination take root.

- The complete route is a combination of bark and paved paths and is approximately 2 miles
- A shorter wheelchair-accessible route is available
- Allow 2 hours to fully enjoy the gardens
- Apply admission to a membership on the day of your visit, and enjoy unlimited visits all year
- No food permitted on the grounds and no refreshments are available
- No pets on the property or left in vehicles
- No professional or portrait photography allowed

- Open Tuesday through Sunday
- Gates open at 10 AM
- Last admission 1 hour before closing

BY CAR: Exit the ferry, head north six miles on Highway 305. Look for signs for Bloedel Reserve, turn right on Agatewood Drive, then curve onto Dolphin Drive.
