FROM THE BAINBRIDGE ISLAND FERRY TERMINAL:

BY CAR: Exit the ferry and head straight six miles north on Highway 305. Look for signs for Bloedel Reserve and turn right on Agatewood, then curve onto Dolphin Drive.
