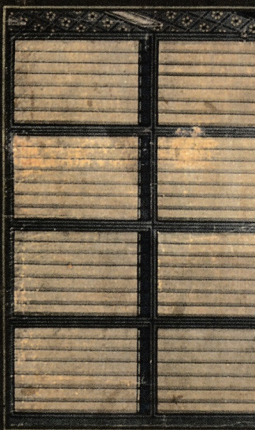

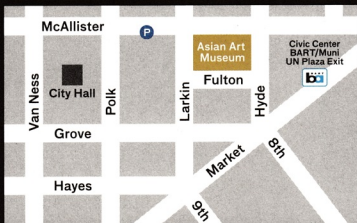
Tuesday through Sunday . . . . . 10 AM to 5 PM
