



"Pull Up a Chair. You are Welcomed Here." Whether it's a friendly greeting offered at the coffee shop or a pat on the empty seat beside us on a **Port Authority** bus or trolley, Pittsburghers are genuinely interested, we love our city and we want to tell you why Pittsburgh is special.

Hospitality from locals is one reason Pittsburgh was named one of the **10 Best Places to Live** in a survey of millennials by Livability.com. The city also remains one of the **Best Places to Retire**, as well as a safe, affordable, culturally rich place to raise a family. Pittsburghers know what "neighborly" means, thanks to our own Fred Rogers of Mister Rogers' Neighborhood, whose bronze **Tribute to Children** statue along the North Shore near **Heinz Field** welcomes people to climb into his lap.

Just as this icon was ahead of his time with children's programming, the Pittsburgh dynamic always has been one of entrepreneurial spirit. This is evident in the **Duquesne and Monongahela Inclines**, one of the city's first forms of transportation, that carry commuters and visitors between Mt. Washington and Station Square. It can be witnessed in the cutting-edge research of **Carnegie Mellon University**, the **University of Pittsburgh** and **UPMC**, and the tech giants who call Pittsburgh home, including Google, Uber, Apple and Amazon. You'll even find our innovative grit on display with the "**Pittsburgh parking chair**" that saves a shoveled parking space on a snowy day.

In the **Golden Triangle** business district, formed by Pittsburgh's three rivers, **Fortune 500 companies** such as Kraft Heinz, PNC Financial Services, PPG Industries and U.S. Steel share real estate with shops, restaurants and boutique hotels. In warm weather, dine al fresco in Market Square, where **Nola on the Square** has live music and the upscale **Ruth's Chris, Morton's** and **Eddie Merlot's** offer steak and seafood. In winter, the **People's Gas Holiday Market** fills the square and the nearby **PPG Place** delights with its **MassMutual Pittsburgh Ice Rink**.

Explore the art galleries of the **Cultural District** and its gorgeous venues for the **Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra**, **Pittsburgh Opera**, **Pittsburgh CLO** and **Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre**.

Or, stroll the grounds of **Point State Park**, with its landmark fountain and the **Fort Pitt Museum**, which tells the story of Pittsburgh's start and the world-shaping events that happened in Western Pennsylvania. Meander around the Point during the **Dollar Bank Three Rivers Arts Festival**. We've got plenty more festivals, all year long, including the unique **Picklesburgh** and the 10-day **Pittsburgh Vintage Grand Prix**.

Wander from Downtown into the **Strip District**, a one-half-square-mile shopping district with ethnic grocers, produce stands, meat and fish markets and sidewalk vendors. **Robotics Row** is transforming this warehouse sector, as are new residential developments with distinctive architecture and many amenities. Like the adjacent **Lawrenceville** neighborhood, the Strip features chef-driven restaurants that make Pittsburgh a foodie haven, such as **Smallman Galley**, **DiAnoia's Eatery**, **Bar Marco** and **Eleven Contemporary Kitchen**. Or, try the sandwich that defines "a 'Burgh thing" at **Primanti Bros.**, with fries, coleslaw, meat and cheese on thick Italian bread.

The North Side is where you'll find two of the city's stadiums — **Heinz Field**, home to the Steelers and the University of Pittsburgh Panthers, and the Pirates' **PNC Park**, one of the most beautiful ballparks in the country. Have a seat and take in the view at the **Water Steps** along the **Three Rivers Heritage Trail**. The Penguins hockey team plays at **PPG Paints Arena** in Uptown.

Pittsburgh's "second downtown" of **Oakland** is home to universities, world-class hospitals, the exceptional **Carnegie Museums of Art and Natural History, Phipps Conservatory and Botanical Gardens** and **Schenley Park**. Pittsburgh's many municipal parks encourage recreation, as do the rivers with their shoreline trails that connect with the **Great Allegheny Passage**. Pittsburgh entices hikers and bikers, with many trails, bike lanes and a bike-sharing program. **OpenStreetsPGH** makes fitness fun to share in three summer events.

Most of the city's 90 neighborhoods have attractions, such as the **Pittsburgh Zoo & PPG Aquarium** and the **National Aviary**, along with gorgeous Victorian architecture that melds with the modern. Lovely old church buildings are repurposed as apartments and, in one restoration, the **Church Brew Works** brewpub.

Swing by the **August Wilson House** in Pittsburgh's Hill District to celebrate the literary and personal legacy of the famous playwright. While there, take a photograph outside his childhood home.

To get around, take a walking tour or hail a ride with a **cab service**. Wherever you go in Pittsburgh, locals will welcome you and suggest popular places to shop, dine or play. So, pull up a chair and hang out for a while. You are welcomed here.






