

First, check out the dramatic skyline. The view is noticeable upon entering the city via the **Fort Pitt Tunnel** and **Bridge**, and it is astounding from atop **Mt. Washington** or the **West End Overlook**.

Stargazing on clear nights culminates a tour of the University of Pittsburgh's **Allegheny Observatory** in Riverview Park (reservations required).

The city's walkable Downtown is even more interesting on a guided walking tour by the **Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation**.

Self-guided tours are available for download, including tours of more than 25 landmarks by **Pittsburgh Art in Public Places**.

The Downtown **Gallery Crawl** is a free, quarterly excursion to destinations in the 14-block Cultural District.

Two unique neighborhoods showcase superb urban planning: **Roslyn Place**, a wooden cul-desac with 18 symmetrical houses, and charming **Chatham Village**.

The **Nationality Rooms** inside the architecturally stunning Cathedral of Learning showcase 31 cultures. Some require a small fee, but 12 are free when classes are not scheduled.

The Frick Pittsburgh's Art Museum is known for its Italian and French art collection. The five acres of beautiful grounds include a Car and Carriage Museum. Nearby Frick Park has miles of wooded hiking trails.

In Troy Hill, **St. Anthony's Chapel** has the largest collection of Catholic relics outside of the Vatican, including pieces of Jesus' cross and bones of the Apostles.

First Presbyterian Church of Pittsburgh has more than 250 spectacular stained-glass windows and an organ with 4,400 pipes.

Built in 1764, **Fort Pitt Block House** is all that remains of Pittsburgh's frontier fort. Now a gift shop, it has a small museum with the fort's artifacts.

Bicycle Heaven began with one discarded bike and now displays thousands, including rare and vintage models and memorabilia, in its museum. The shop sells, rents and repairs bicycles.

Pittsburgh Glass Center is an art gallery, glass studio and community builder. Take a class or watch a live, hot glass demonstration. Worldrenowned artists teach and create here. "The Workers" is a unique sculpture that honors steelworkers alongside the Three Rivers Heritage Trail in Southside Riverfront Park. The oversized figures invite human interaction.

In the summer, movie lovers flock to **Dollar Bank Cinema in the Park**, free weekly movies under the stars in seven city parks.

Another favorite of locals is **Pittsburgh Banjo Club on the North Side**, which holds free public practices at Allegheny Elks Lodge #339 on Wednesday evenings.



Children's Museum of Pittsburgh



Today, arts and culture still contribute to the quality of life and diversity in Pittsburgh, where artists hold a special place in the community. Original works are showcased at traditional and nonconformist galleries, maker spaces and festivals that have made Pittsburgh a destination for art lovers.

Carnegie Museum of Art (CMOA) collects and presents artworks from around the world to engage and reflect multiple audiences. Its more than 32,000 objects include paintings, sculptures, prints, drawings and photographs. CMOA programming explores the role of art and artists in confronting social issues.

The Frick Pittsburgh presents art and history in an indelible way. Tour the art museum or Clayton, the preserved home of industrialist Henry Clay Frick, to view fine and decorative arts from the Renaissance to the present. The Car and Carriage Museum has automobiles from the turn of the 20th century.

The life and legacy of pop art icon Andy Warhol is archived at **The Andy Warhol Museum**, a renovated warehouse with seven floors and a basement studio. Rotating exhibitions dive into the museum's collection or feature contemporary artists who resonate with Warhol's life and work.

The Mattress Factory, an art installation museum in three buildings, supports established and emerging artists through a residency program. The museum has presented unconventional and thought-provoking works by more than 750 artists.

Once a family home, **La Hutte Royal** (or The Royal Hut) has been transformed into an unusual art experience by German artist Thorsten Brinkmann, using art, collectables and everyday objects. Visitors will find rooms covered in records and sculptures made from molds of body parts. Make sure to navigate your way down hatches, up ladders and through fireplaces.

Both gallery and studio, the **Pittsburgh Glass Center** has a school to teach glass art. Studio
workshops and community outreach programs also
are a hallmark of **Contemporary Craft**, which has
a gift shop with jewelry, ceramics, glass and more.

Abandoned Pittsburgh is a photography project and art gallery centered around the city's industrial past. With five to six exhibitions annually, SPACE values the creation of new works in multidisciplines. Wood Street Galleries is a visual arts project which features multi-disciplinary artists from around the globe. And, BOOM Concepts in Garfield is a space for local artists to build and grow within the Pittsburgh community. Check out their flagship location during the next monthly Unblurred: First Friday Gallery Crawl.

Explore galleries, stages, storefronts and unique public spaces on one of the quarterly **Gallery Crawl** events sponsored by **Pittsburgh Cultural Trust**. Or, download a self-guided tour of urban art, murals and sculptures from the **Office of Public Art** at pittsburghartscouncil.org.
