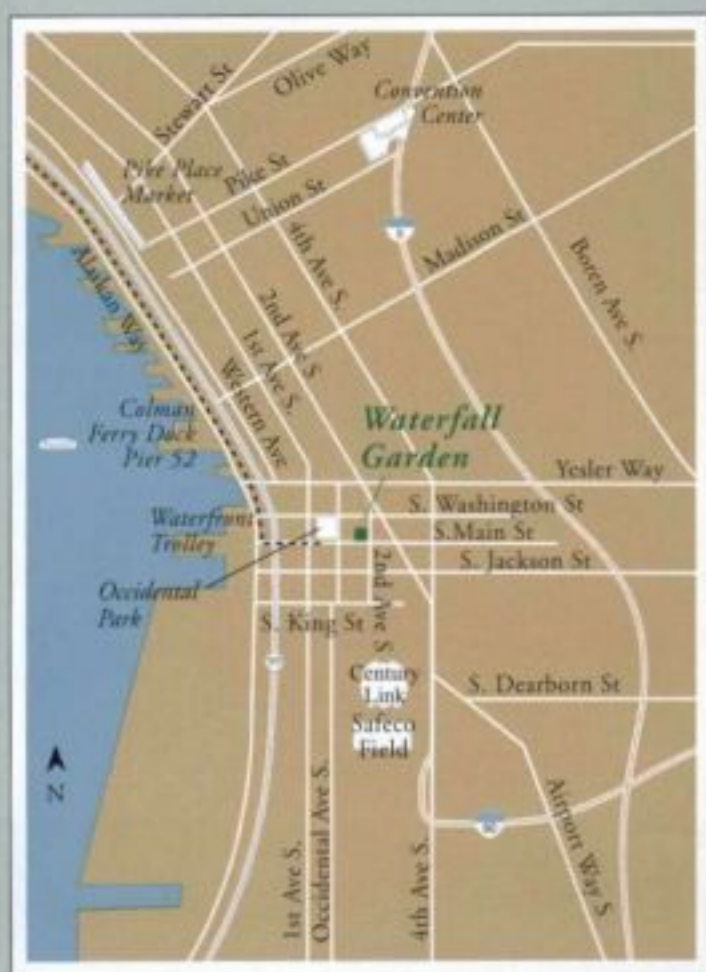

The park was designed by Masao Kinoshita of Sasaki Associates, Inc., Watertown, Massachusetts. The design was intended to provide a special environment within the city where one can experience a closeness to nature, surrounded by water, stone, trees and flowering plants.

From I-5, north or southbound: Exit to James St., and turn west toward the water. Turn left on Second Ave. and immediately angle right at the "Y". Go straight across S. Washington to stay on Second. The Garden is one block ahead, across from the fire station.

From Colman Dock Ferry Terminal: Turn right and go five blocks south. Turn left at S. King St. and immediately left again under the Viaduct (Hwy. 99). Go two blocks north and right on S. Main St. The garden is two blocks east, across from the fire station.
