Gordon House Timeline

- **1957:** Conrad & Evelyn Gordon meet Mr. Wright, and he completes the design for a Usonian-style farm house in Oregon.
- **1964:** The Gordons build and move into their house along the Willamette River in Clackamas County.
- **1991:** The American Institute of Architects resolves to recognize Frank Lloyd Wright as among the Greatest Architects of all time.
- **2001:** The house is saved from demolition after Evelyn's death and moved from its original site to Silverton, at The Oregon Garden.
- **2004:** The house is recognized as an Oregon State Architectural Treasure and listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
- **Today:** Visitors tour the restored Gordon House to see a significant architectural landmark and a snapshot of the Gordons' life in the 1960s. More than 100,000 people have toured since 2001.

Silverton is 15 miles east of Salem and 40 miles south of Downtown Portland at The Oregon Garden.
