Seeing Nature: Landscape Masterworks from the Paul G.

Allen Family Collection features 39 masterpieces exploring the evolution of European and American landscape painting from the collection of Paul G. Allen, Microsoft co-founder and philanthropist.

This exhibition presents masterworks spanning nearly four hundred years—from Jan Brueghel the Younger's series devoted to the five senses to Canaletto's celebrated views of Venice to landscapes by innovators including Joseph Mallord William Turner, Paul Cézanne, and Gustav Klimt. Paintings by Thomas Moran, Edward Hopper, Georgia O'Keeffe, and others provide an American perspective on landscapes at home and abroad.

The exhibition is co-organized by Portland Art Museum, the Seattle Art Museum and the Paul G. Allen Family Collection. The New Orleans presentation is sponsored by the New Orleans Convention and Visitors Bureau.
