Book a guided tour for your family, friends, or organization by calling 604-501-5050. Cost is \$5 per person; minimum group size of five people (book two weeks in advance).


Accessibility

The main pathways are gravel with slight inclines; they may be suitable for some wheelchair users. With prior notice, golf cart tours may be arranged for up to three people.





Darts Hill Garden is the result of over 70 years of hard work and dedication, all guided by the clear vision of Francisca Darts.

From its humble beginnings as an overgrown tract of land, Edwin and Francisca Darts transformed their acreage. As Francisca's love of horticulture grew, so did her vision of creating a garden unlike any other. This is Francisca Darts' living legacy - a plantsman's garden featuring an immense collection of now mature shrubs and trees from around the world.

In 1994, Edwin and Francisca Darts donated the garden to the City of Surrey and its citizens. Their intention was to give Surrey its own garden to be used as a horticultural centre for the preservation, enhancement, and development of plants. The non-profit Darts Hill Garden Conservancy Trust Society works with the City of Surrey towards these goals.
