King Pine also offers night skiing, lift-serviced snowtubing, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, ice-skating, family events, and après ski fun.

Owned and operated by generations of the Hoyt Family since the late 1800s, Purity Spring Resort has been providing hospitality and the rich tradition of family-oriented recreational activities for over 100 years. In 1938, a rope tow was installed and Milt Hoyt brought small groups of guests to the Inn to enjoy the relatively new sport of snow skiing. The Ski & Snowboard Camp for boys and girls was started in 1939 and is known as the longest-running ski camp in the country. King Pine Ski Area opened in 1962. Today, with a network of well-maintained surface and chairlifts, quality snowmaking, and a reputation of being 100% open, family fun remains the soul of King Pine and a winter tradition for you to discover.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY CODE

NH law states that each participant in the sport of skiing and snowboarding "accepts as a matter of law, the dangers inherent in the sport, and to that extent may not maintain an action against the operator for any injuries which result from such inherent risks, dangers, or hazards," et al. Please refer to NH Statutes Section 22:5-A:2.4. Common sense, awareness, respect for others, respect for the natural environment, and respect for the ski area operation goes a long way toward reducing your risks while out on the hill. Please practice Your Responsibility Code, and promptly report any irresponsible behavior you see to King Pine Ski Area personnel.

- » Always stay in control, and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
- » People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- » You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
- » Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- » Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.

- » Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- » Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride, and unload safely.

(Note: This is a partial list. The Code is endorsed by the National Ski Areas Association.)

TREE SKIING Tree skiing areas are not patrolled, may contain unmarked hazards, and are recommended for advanced skiers and riders only.

NORDIC SKIER COURTESY & RESPONSIBILITY CODE In addition to the aforementioned Skier Responsibility Code, please have your ticket visible at all times, stay on marked trail system, do not walk on ski tracks, do not litter, and be safety conscious.

UPHILL TRAVEL POLICY Uphill travel on the alpine trails at King Pine is allowed. A season pass, alpine, or Nordic ticket is required to access trails during operational hours and user agrees to terms, conditions, acknowledgment of risk (RSA 225A:3), and release of liability. Please visit KingPine.com for additional Uphill Travel Policy requirements and recommendations.

DRONE USE POLICY Due to safety and privacy concerns, King Pine Ski Area prohibits the operation or use on or above resort property of unmanned aerial systems or drones. This prohibition extends to any devices launched or operated from resort property, as well as any launched from private property outside of the resort boundaries.

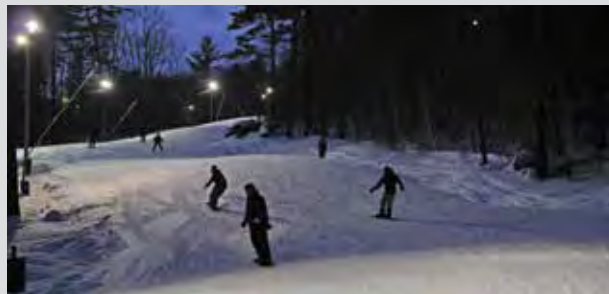
