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A Day at the Beach



Life along the shore is delightful and not just during the summer. Swimming, sunning, birding, biking, jogging and fishing are just some of the appeal of coastal Connecticut. For a waterfront tour of the region, you'll want to start at Silver Sands Beach State Park. Though Charles Island is now home to a bird sanctuary, rumor has it Captain Kid used it as a hiding place for his treasure back in 1699. While Charles Island is clearly visible from the park and can be reached on foot during low tide, extreme caution is required to avoid being stranded when the tide rises. Check with park officials before heading out. As you mosey along the Milford shoreline, you'll pass Walnut Beach, the Downtown Milford Green/Milford Harbor, Gulf Beach, Pond Point and Anchor Beach. At Oyster River you will cross over to West Haven with its spectacular beaches.

On West Haven's Bradley Point, Old Glory sways proudly in the breeze

over the Veterans Walk of Honor which includes memorials for both the Korean and Vietnam Wars. The Point also marks the start of a 1.7 mile beachfront path.

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Next stop: Lighthouse Point Park, the shining jewel of the New Haven Department of Parks, Recreation and Trees in the Morris Cove section of New Haven. There are two "must see" attractions on the beachfront property. The first, Five Mile Point Lighthouse, is impossible to miss. This imposing 70 foot lighthouse is constructed from sandstone quarried from East Haven with a solid brick interior. Its spiral granite staircase leads up to the lantern loft where the lighthouse lens was mounted. The current tower was built in 1845 replacing the original 1805 lighthouse.

The second gem on this leg of your journey is the fully restored Lighthouse Point Carousel. Built in 1916, the carousel is one of the few carousels from the era that is still operational. It has 69 horses, one camel and two dragon chariots. The outer rim of the carousel contains original oil paintings of local scenes of New Haven as well as various boats, trains, mermaids and lighthouses. Both the lighthouse and carousel are listed on the National Registry of Historic Places.



New Haven is home to a second lighthouse, the **Southwest Ledge Lighthouse**. On a perfect day, you might be able to catch a glimpse of the working lighthouse from Lighthouse Point Park. Your best bet is to view the lighthouse by boat.

Just a hop, skip and a jump on to East Haven, where you can find the local favorite beach spot, **Cosey Beach**. Features a fun splash pad for the kids!

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The Shore Line Trolley Museum in East Haven is a trolley fan's paradise. The Museum contains memorabilia from the trolley's heyday including nearly 100 vintage transit vehicles, nearly 30,000 photographic images, over 4,000 books and documents, and about 1,000 small artifacts such as tokens, hat badges and ticket punches. Shore Line Trolley is the oldest operating trolley trolley line in the United States, featuring 1.5 miles of track. Hours vary seasonally. Next stop Branford!



Undoubtedly the **Thimble Islands**, off the coast of Branford, are the stars of this quaint seaside village. Board the Volsunga IV, the Sea Mist or the Adriaen B. for 45 minute narrated tours of the islands. Enjoy the views of the stunning vacation homes or travel back in time while you listen to pirate stories.
