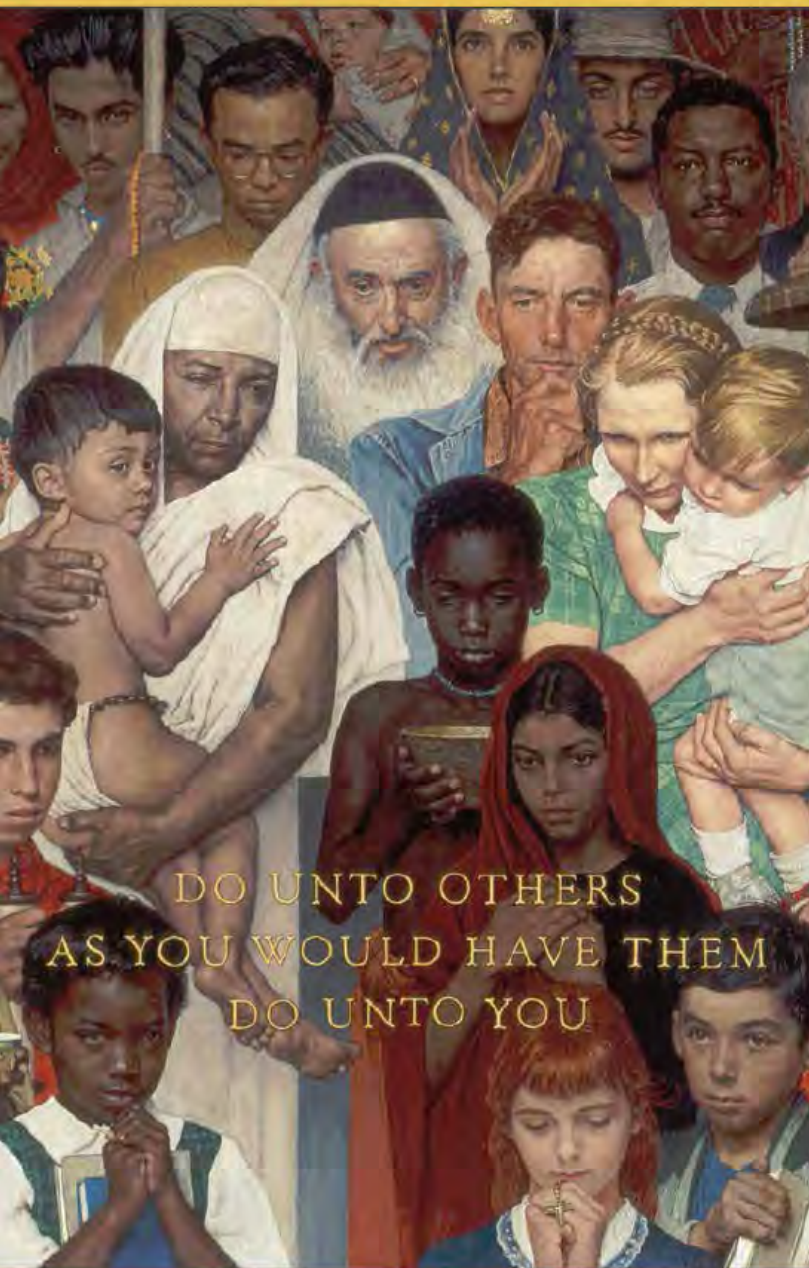

hours

Open year-round. May - October: Open daily 10 a.m. - 5 p.m.
November - April: Weekdays 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. Weekends and holidays 10 a.m. - 5 p.m. Closed New Year's Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. Rockwell's studio is open May - October.

location

The Museum is located at 9 Route 183 in Stockbridge, less than a mile south of the junction of Routes 183 and 102. The Museum is a 2.5 hour drive from Boston or New York City, and one hour from Albany and Hartford/Springfield airports.

admission & membership

An admission fee is charged. Kids 5 and under are free, as are Museum members. Become a member when you visit, and receive free admission. The Museum building and Rockwell's Studio are wheelchair accessible.

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museum

Come home to Norman Rockwell Museum! Enjoy the world's largest collection of original Rockwell art, including many of his most beloved works for *The Saturday Evening Post*, the iconic *Four Freedoms*, and his inspiring later work, which explored social issues of the day. Each work tells a story of America, filled with Rockwell's trademark warmth and humor. The Museum also houses the Norman Rockwell archives, an extensive collection of the artist's papers and reference photographs.

As the leading museum of American illustration, Rockwell's proud profession, Norman Rockwell Museum is the place to learn more about this important and far-reaching art form. Changing exhibitions explore everything from graphic novels to children's book illustrations.

studio

Visit Rockwell's historic Stockbridge studio, located just a short stroll from the Museum's main galleries. Step inside (and back in time) to experience the creative environment where Rockwell thrived. The studio is open May through October.



grounds

Explore the natural beauty and history of our grounds year-round. The Museum, designed by noted architect Robert A.M. Stern, is located on 36 scenic acres in the Berkshires of Western Massachusetts. Bronze and stone sculptures by Rockwell's youngest son, Peter Rockwell, decorate the campus, and a historic Berkshire "cottage" from the Victorian era also graces the grounds. From May to October, enjoy lunch or snacks at our terrace café with panoramic views.
