1 Memorial Grove Park

Nebraska & Pine, Fort Leonard Wood

A walkway through the Park connects the Engineer, Military Police, and Chemical Corps Memorials. A combined memorial joins all branches together honoring the Veterans of each conflict throughout the history of the United States.



2 Engineer Memorial

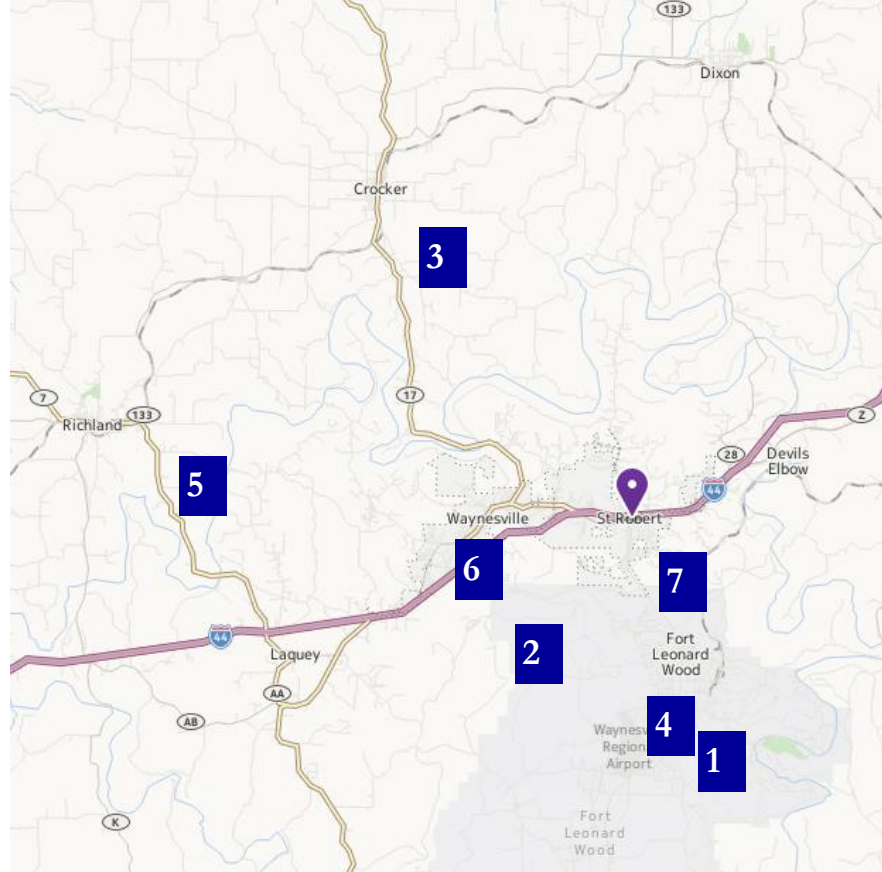
Engineers have been represented in every US conflict since the Revolutionary War. Fort Leonard Wood honors these soldiers in "Sapper Grove" with their Wall of Fallen Soldiers.

3 Military Police Memorial

This memorial is dedicated to all members of the Military Police Corps who gave their lives to further the mission world-wide and to preserve the freedom of our country.

4 Chemical Corps Memorial

Since its inception in 1918, the Chemical Corps has been the nation's protective force against chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear (CBRN) threats. This Memorial serves to honor those Chemical Corps Veterans who have served over the years.



2 Missouri State Veterans Cemetery

Exit 156—25350 Hwy H Waynesville

A partnership between the State and Federal Governments, along with the donation of 129 beautiful acres from Fort Leonard Wood, makes this the fifth Veterans Cemetery in Missouri. The Memorial fountain was donated by citizens of Pulaski County in an organized effort by the Waynesville-St. Robert Chamber of Commerce. A Korean War Memorial was dedicated in 2013.



3 Crocker Veterans Memorial

Located within Frisco Park to honor all those who have served for their country

4 Joint Services Park

Junction of Missouri and North Dakota Aves.

Joint Service Park was designed to pay respect to all branches of our great military. Take a walk through the park and learn about each branch and each piece of equipment displayed to represent them. Thank you to our past, present and future military service members. Coast Guard, Air Force, Army, Marines, and Navy.

5 Richland Veterans Memorial

S Hwy 133/Hwy 7 Richland

Just down the street from City Hall, stands the Veterans Memorial placed by Troop 70 of the Eagles Scouts. During every major Patriotic holiday, 24 flags fly in remembrance of those who sacrificed their lives for their country.

6 Sunset Memorial Estates

Exit 156—Hwy 17 Waynesville

Memorial Chapels and Crematory dedicated this Memorial to honor the personal commitment of Veterans in the community.
