 many late-blooming protea species and unique, hot pink Guernsey
 lilies blooming en masse in the South Africa collection; the giant
 tree dahlias, tree daisies, tree fuchsias, vireya rhododendran, and
 many more fascinating fall-flowering plants in the Garden's Cloud
 Forest collections; and classic fall color as the japanese maples and
 magnolias lose their leaves in the Moon Viewing Garden and beyond.
- FREE Autumn docent tours and hands-on interpretation stations on most weekends.

HOURS & LOCATION

Open Daily at 7:30am in Golden Gate Park. Closed one hour after last entry.

Last entry changes seasonally: 4pm from the 1st Sunday in November through January.

Entrances on Ninth Ave. at Lincoln Way (Main Gate) & at MLK Jr. Drive off the Music Concourse (Friend [North] Gate).

Note: Use Main Gate for early entry. Friend (North) Gate opens at 9am.

ADMISSION

Members & SF residents (with proof of residency): FREE Non-residents: \$9 general; \$6 youth 12–17 & seniors; \$2 children 5–11; FREE children 4 & under; \$19 families of 2 adults & children 18 & under The Garden is free to all visitors daily 7:30–9am, and on the second Tuesday of every month, as well as Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day.

PARKING

Limited free street parking is available in Golden Gate Park. Additional paid parking and bicycle racks are located in the Music Concourse Garage.
