Muriel Kauffman Theatre has 1,800 seats in six sections. The red color scheme and the shimmering balustrades are reminiscent of 18th and 19th-century opera houses. The abstract murals behind the box seating on either side of the stage were designed and installed by Kansas City Art Institute students under the supervision of architect Moshe Safdie.

Hydraulic lifts allow the first four rows of orchestra seating to be easily removed, allowing an orchestra pit to be raised from below. The Figaro Simutext Seatback System brings subtitles to each patron's seat, providing translation for operas and foreign language presentations.

The stage area is 100 feet wide and 50 feet deep. A fly tower rises 74 feet above allowing scenery as tall as 35 feet to be flown above the stage. Dramatic entrances and scene changes are made possible by a flexible trap floor system in the stage floor. A wooden floor with special bounce is installed for dance performances and a large scenery dock located stage right provides access for loading in scenery and equipment from the Broadway side of the building.

Helzberg Hall


Helzberg Hall's 1,600 seats are arranged in vineyard-style seating, with no seat more than 100 feet from the performers on stage. The 2,600 square foot stage is hollow and constructed of Alaskan cedar because of its ability to transmit sound vibration. It can be used flat or with up to four sets of hydraulic risers that allow quick and flexible staging for performing groups. The walls are made of Douglas fir and the seating area floors are oak. The plaster ceiling is three inches thick. These elements were carefully incorporated in the hall's design for the acoustical qualities and ability to bring musicians together as a unified instrument.

Five skylights bring daylight into the hall, reflecting on the rear curved wall. The Julia Irene Kauffman Casavant Organ, Opus 3875 has 5,548 pipes, 102 ranks and 79 stops. The largest pipe is 32 feet tall and weighs approximately 960 pounds, while the smallest pipe is the size of a pencil.
