





Skate rentals are available on site. When the temperature is just right (as in, "way cold!"), you can also find your way to some 30 **natural ice rinks** in neighbourhoods around the city. • The Credit River boasts large runs of chinook salmon and steelhead as well as some coho and Atlantic salmon. Popular fishing spots include Erindale Park 249 for salmon and trout, J.C. Saddington Park 509, for carp, salmon and trout.

• Thousands of sport fishing enthusiasts also ply the waters of Lake Ontario for Chinook and Coho Salmon, as well as rainbow trout, brown trout and lake trout. You'll find local charters available, such as Sea Angel Charters or Moby Nick Fishing Charters to take you offshore—or you can head to Lakefront Promenade Park 269, to fish from the shore.

• Inland, Lake Aquitaine 279 is another popular spot for urban anglers. It hosts species like sunfish, rock bass and perch. **(P)** *
