Grand Opening of Revolution Place!

Saturday and Sunday, June 9 - 10

Don't miss the Museum's new discovery center, Revolution Place, that brings to life the Museum's lively and diverse neighborhood during the 1770s and invites families to learn through hands-on exploration. During opening weekend, the Museum will host "Liberation 1778," a living history event marking the liberation of Philadelphia from American forces in 1778.

Flag Day and Father's Day Weekend

Thursday - Sunday, June 14 - 17

In honor of Flag Day, the Museum will display for one weekend only George Washington's Commander-in-Chief's Standard, the flag that marked his presence on the battlefield. Guests can design their own flag, and try cutting a six-pointed star like the one on Washington's Standard.

Independence Day Celebration

Saturday, June 30 - Wednesday, July 4

Celebrate Independence Day with music, family-friendly activities, and costumed historical interpreters. On the plaza, visitors can leave their comments in an interactive installation, *Declarations*, to reflect on the document's legacy around the world.

Celebrate Revolutionary Fifers and Drummers

Saturday, August 18

Join costumed interpreters for free activities on the Museum's outdoor plaza including demonstrations, free toy fifes (while supplies last), and replica instruments that visitors can try.

Clean out those summer cobwebs by learning about our nation's founding. Find out how children in the 1770s learned their ABCs, apprenticed for trades, and grew up to be Revolutionaries.
