After her induction in 2013, Hingis got back on court, returning to the No. 1 spot in doubles, winning five additional major titles in doubles and mixed.

Arthur Ashe led the United States to four Davis Cup titles, and was the first and only African-American man to win a major title, winning the singles title at Wimbledon, the US Open, and the Australian Open. Don't let the unassuming storefront in downtown

Newport fool you. As soon as you wander through the arched entryway and see the historic grass tennis courts and architecture, you'll be transported to a different time and a spectacular place.

The International Tennis Hall of Fame is housed in the Newport Casino, built in 1880. It began as a social club for the East Coast elite who summered by the sea. One year later, the sprawling seven-acre property was home to the first U.S. National Championships-now called the US Open.
