

Historic Vessels

Even the most confirmed landlubbers will be transformed into savvy sea dogs after boarding one of the historic vessels at Mystic Seaport Museum. From the world's sole surviving wooden whaleship, the Charles W. Morgan, to the last example of early 20th-century New England fishing schooners, the L.A. Dunton, these vessels offer a glimpse of long-past seafaring days.

Henry B. duPont Preservation Shipyard: A Working Shipyard

Witness the art of wooden shipbuilding, an awe-inspiring opportunity to watch skilled craftspeople perform skills made nearly extinct by steel and fiberglass.

Seafaring Village

Wind your way through a recreated seafaring village and explore some original New England buildings staffed with historians, musicians, storytellers, and craftspeople, who bring our seafaring heritage to life.
