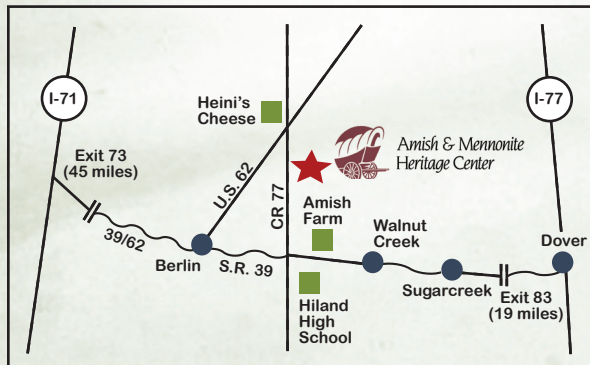

*Behalt* is a 10 ft. x 265 ft. oil-on-canvas painting that illustrates the heritage of the Amish and Mennonite people from their Anabaptist beginnings in Zurich, Switzerland, to the present day. *Behalt* means “to keep” or “remember.”

## Guided Tours

Local Amish and Mennonite guides will take you on a 30-minute tour of *Behalt*, pointing out the highlights of the painting. Tours include a 15-minute video on the local plain community.

## One-Room School | Pioneer Barn

Learn about Amish education and its connection to one-room public schools in our restored, pre-Civil War school house. In the pioneer barn, you will see an Amish buggy display and an original conestoga wagon that brought early settlers from Pennsylvania to this region.
